This has been a year very much of settling down and stabilising all of the new and expanded services; it has been a year filled with staff recruitment and training. Early in the year we engaged in a restructuring of services and management systems. We recruited three managers to form a new service management team to improve support to the growing frontline team. This also enabled us to increase our opportunities for volunteers and student placements which have been a great asset to the organisation.  
As well as significant developments in personnel and procedures, this year saw a major physical improvement with a move to a much more suitable office to house the growing team in Loughborough and a second move on the horizon for our City based team.  
Once again we are delighted with developments in our fundraising activities, not only are these events supporting the work we do but it is a great way to raise awareness of domestic abuse and the help that is available to those affected.  
Finally, as always a huge thank you to all of our staff, volunteers, fellow Directors, partners and supporters for making the work of LWA possible and making a huge difference to the lives of so many people.




This year Outreach supported 929 adults and 1,234 children, to rebuild their lives after domestic abuse.



The City Family Service supported 518 children and young people and 90 parents.

### THE RECOVERY TOOLKIT

Twenty eight group programmes, including the Freedom Programme, Recovery Toolkit, Unbroken and Unbreakable run over the year with two hundred and thirty participants.



122 sessions of crèche provided to enable parents to attend groups, court and support sessions. Forty eight parents benefitted from this service.

## SERVICES



Six respite activities for families including a Christmas party and a trip to the seaside.



Successful launch of the Coalville Colour Run, with over 500 runners, raising an amazing £10k!

## OTHER HIGHLIGHTS DURING THE YEAR

Secured funding from Leicestershire County Council to start providing 1-2-1 support to children and young people within the County who have witnessed abuse in the home.

Following the successful tender in 2015/16, Project 360 has been expanded, with new staff recruited and trained to meet the support needs of clients with repeat police call outs.
